Anointing of the Sick: Those wishing to receive Holy Communion or to have a priest visit them for the Anointing of the Sick can contact the parish office.

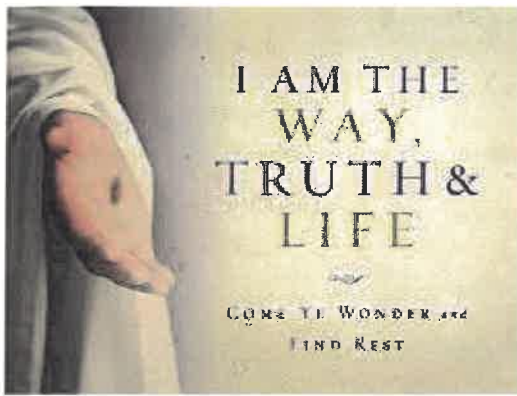
Funerals: In the event of a death and you need to arrange for a funeral, please call the parish office. Call the emergency line if the emergency occurs at a time when the office is not open.

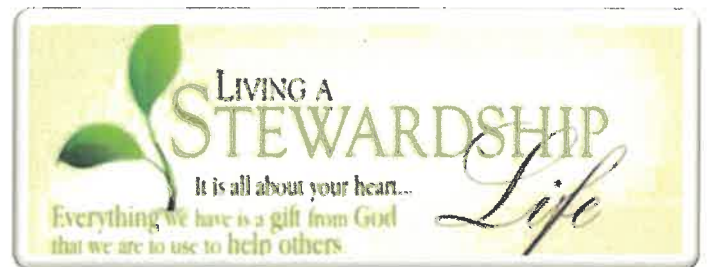

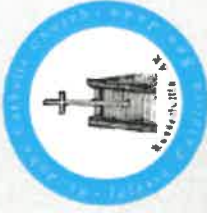

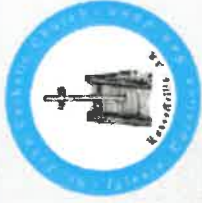

Saint Francis: Visionary of Life

“Hold fast to the memory of our father and brother, Francis, for the praise and glory of Him who made him great among us and glorified him in the sight of the angels.”¹

Saint Francis, the poor man of Assisi, is a powerful model for us in building a world and culture that is authentically pro-life. This 13th century saint was a visionary of the radiant goodness of human life.

Early in Saint Francis’ conversion, he was riding through the countryside and came across a person suffering from leprosy. Despite being repelled by the appearance and smell, he came down from his horse and kissed the hand of the leper, who returned his kiss of peace, filling Francis with joy. He could see the invaluable dignity of every person, even amidst utter poverty, the disfigurement of disease, and the stain of sin.

Saint Francis is well-known for his radical imitation of Christ and his love for all creation. This is evident in his prayer, “The Canticle of the Creatures,” which praises God for all He has created: the sun, moon, and stars; wind, water, and fire. Francis proclaims that the created world reveals the glory of God himself. This is particularly true for the human person, created in the image of God, whose life from conception to natural death is to be honored and protected. Among all creation, the human person has the unique capacity to praise God, highlighting the distinctive dignity of human life.

Strikingly, Francis uttered his “Canticle” while lying half-blind on his deathbed. In welcoming “Sister Death,” Francis could no longer physically see the beauty of creation, yet still he praised God for the created world around him.

Oftentimes we, too, are blinded to the goodness of life. Our vision may be blurred by hardships such as poverty, fragility, or suffering, all of which Saint Francis experienced in his earthly life. In the



face of such challenges, Saint Francis is a powerful intercessor, opening our heart and eyes to the gift of life even in the most trying circumstances. Francis had a particular devotion to the Lord’s own vulnerability—in the manger, in the Eucharist, and on the Cross—highlighting God’s presence in the most defenseless among us.

Pope Leo XIV has decreed that for 2026 “a special Year of Saint Francis shall be proclaimed, in which every faithful Christian, following the example of the Saint of Assisi, shall become a model of holiness of life and a constant witness of peace.”² The taking of innocent human life through abortion, assisted suicide, and other acts of violence destroys peace in our world.³ We are called to be witnesses of peace by boldly proclaiming the dignity of the human person and working for the protection of all human life.

In this Year of Saint Francis, may he help us to see the beauty of life in all of creation, in particular, in the weakest and most vulnerable among us. Together, let us pray for the protection of human life and the courage to defend it.

San Francisco: visionario de la vida

“Recuerden a nuestro padre y hermano Francisco, para alabanza y gloria de Dios, pues Él lo ha engrandecido entre los hombres y lo ha glorificado ante los ángeles”.¹

San Francisco, el pobre hombre de Asís, es un modelo poderoso para nosotros en la edificación de un mundo y una cultura auténticamente pro vida. Este santo del siglo XIII fue un visionario de la radiante bondad de la vida humana.

Al principio de la conversión de san Francisco, cabalgaba por el campo y se encontró con una persona que padecía lepra. A pesar de que le repugnaba la apariencia y el olor, bajó de su caballo y besó la mano del leproso, que le devolvió el beso de paz, llenando a Francisco de alegría. Podía ver la dignidad invaluable de cada persona, incluso en medio de la pobreza absoluta, la desfiguración de la enfermedad y la mancha del pecado.

San Francisco es conocido por su imitación radical de Cristo y su amor por toda la creación. Esto se evidencia en su oración, “Cántico de las criaturas”, que alaba a Dios por todo lo que ha creado: el sol, la luna y las estrellas; el viento, el agua y el fuego. Francisco proclama que el mundo creado revela la mismísima gloria de Dios. Esto es especialmente cierto para la persona, creada a imagen de Dios, cuya vida desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural debe ser honrada y protegida. Entre toda la creación, la persona tiene la capacidad única de alabar a Dios, destacando la dignidad distintiva de la vida humana.

Es sorprendente que Francisco pronunció su “Cántico” mientras yacía medio ciego en su lecho de muerte. Al dar la bienvenida a la “Hermana Muerte”, Francisco ya no podía ver físicamente la belleza de la creación, pero aun así alababa a Dios por el mundo creado que le rodeaba.

Muchas veces nosotros también estamos cegados ante la bondad de la vida. Nuestra visión puede nublarse por dificultades como la pobreza, la fragilidad o el



sufrimiento, todas ellas que san Francisco conoció en su vida terrenal. Frente a tales desafíos, san Francisco es un poderoso intercesor, abriendo nuestro corazón y nuestros ojos al don de la vida incluso en las circunstancias más difíciles. Francisco tenía una devoción particular por la propia vulnerabilidad del Señor—en el pesebre, en la Eucaristía y en la Cruz—destacando la presencia de Dios en los más indefensos entre nosotros.

El papa León XIV ha decretado que para 2026 “se proclamará un Año especial de san Francisco, en el que todo cristiano fiel, siguiendo el ejemplo del Santo de Asís, se convertirá en un modelo de santidad de vida y un testimonio constante de paz.”² La destrucción de vidas humanas inocentes mediante el aborto, el suicidio asistido y otros actos de violencia destruyen la paz en nuestro mundo.³ Estamos llamados a ser testigos de la paz proclamando con valentía la dignidad de la persona humana y trabajando por la protección de toda vida humana.

En este Año de san Francisco, que nos ayude a ver la belleza de la vida en toda la creación, en particular, en los más débiles y vulnerables entre nosotros. Juntos, recemos por la protección de la vida humana y el valor para defenderla.
